

**ATTN: ORTHOPAEDIC SURGEONS**

Myunsung Medical Center (MCM) is a modern African hospital in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. It was built by a large Korean Presbyterian church in Seoul, as a mission outreach to the people of Ethiopia. The administrative staff is operated by strong, committed Korean Christians. Patients come from 200-300 kilometers daily to be seen. MCM serves the 80 million people of Ethiopia plus referrals from Sudan, Somalia and Eritrea. There are 4 operating rooms, an image intensifier, and CT scanner.

**Need:** Volunteer Orthopaedic surgeons for teaching and upgrading level of care. The medical staff and Orthopaedic residents from the government hospital will be the target groups. With total lack of equipment and training of the health care professionals, the government hospital is unable to offer even the basic Orthopaedic care. Clinic, operating time and discussion time will be provided. The residents commonly have not even seen our most basic surgical procedures. Instruments and implants are uncommon and brought from developed countries as donations.

**Time Period:** 2-4 wks (dates open starting September 2009)

**Expenses:** Guest house on campus has nice accommodations and dining facilities at a minimal cost.

**Location:** Addis Ababa, Ethiopia; 10 minutes from Bole international airport

**Witness:** Individual opportunities and by leadership. Multiple mission points available.

My wife and I will return September 2009 to take up residence on campus and serve as Coordinator of Orthopaedic Surgery and Barbara, as Hostess.
